Now, a word about IGDS No. 624 (Agreed termination)! This document has given rise to many contrasting and sometimes even outraged reactions. A few days before its publication, the Administration did indeed inform the Staff Union but did not take into account any of the comments or requests that the Staff Union raised. Our position is clear: the conditions of this IGDS should be offered to all staff without distinction of category, grade or background. Despite its assertions, which run totally counter to a "One ILO" approach, the Administration seems to be offering a (very) nice Christmas present to some, while excluding a part of the staff. Moreover, the Union has clearly warned the Administration that such an initiative would generate an additional burden for the Professional and senior staff remaining in post. If this decision is part of an objective to decentralize more Professional posts, it must absolutely be accompanied by a strategy on how to fill these posts and thus ensure mobility in a career development perspective.

Negotiations on new policies on flexible working arrangements and parental leave are progressing and we hope that the new year will see their implementation very quickly.

Following the elections, the Staff Union Committee has been enriched by four new members; the "old hands" welcome them and look forward to working with them in this new mandate.

A new Committee means a new Bureau! A new Chairperson has been elected by the Staff Union Committee for the year 2023. The Staff Union warmly thanks the outgoing Chairperson who is still active in the Bureau.
